Rong Zhu is an Assistant Professor of Chemistry at Peking University (PKU), China. He earned his B.S. at PKU in 2010 and Ph.D. at MIT in 2015, where he conducted graduate research with Prof. Steve Buchwald. After postdoctoral training with Prof. Tim Swager at MIT, he joined PKU in 2018.

The Zhu lab's research centers on the development of innovative catalytic transformations and molecular designs to enable novel carbon-chain macromolecules possessing unique material properties.

Rong has received several early career awards, such as Chinese Chemical Society Young Chemist Award, National Science Foundation of China Excellent Young Scientist, Society of Polymer Science Japan International Leading Young Scientist Lectureship, Asian Core Program Lectureship, and Thieme Chemistry Journal Award.
